Grace has benefitted from the service and ministry of Trisha Pull as our KidsMin Lead this year. However, as you have been informed before, her role on the Grace staff is coming to a close. Trisha has established some procedures and protocols that Grace plans to continue after her departure. Expressing your appreciation to her would be encouraged! She has been a dedicated, energetic, forward-looking, organized child of God (slash) staff member, who loves God, kids, and their families.

Here are some bits of information as we go forward with our kids ministries:

- -Trisha's last official day as a staff member is May 31.
- -Mariya Wiens is continuing in her staff role in Grace's KidsMin department.
- -Sunday, May 19, is the last day of Kids Sunday School before the summer break.
- -Nursery (9:30) and Kids Church (~10:00) are planned for the summer.
- -Big Church will meet for all ages at 9:30am May 26 through Sept 1.
- -VBS (YAK) has been suspended this June.
- -A KidsMin Interim Leadership Team is being formed to work alongside Mariya.
- -Plans are to navigate kids ministries next fall similarly to those of this last school year.



Highlights: 2024 North Central District Conference Annual Meeting

Liz Christie and I were blessed with the opportunity to represent Grace Church-Fridley at the Annual Meeting held April 8-9 at New Hope Church. The North Central District of the Evangelical Free Church of America includes most of Minnesota.

- 1. The Conference celebrated the ministry of David Linde, Director of Placement and Credentialing, who is retiring at the end of May. Frank Lanier will be taking on his duties in Pastoral Placement and Dave Abernethy will be serving our churches in Credentialing.
- 2. Additional staff changes include Kelly Larson, who is now serving as NCD Director of Finance, freeing Paul Anderson to increase his focus on the North Central Foundation, Resource Development, and direct ministry to churches.
- 3. It was announced that Dave Bliss (a longtime ReachGlobal missionary in Bulgaria) will be serving as our new Director of Missions Mobilization as of July 1st. Steve Austvold will continue to serve part-time alongside Dave to establish him as NCD's Mission Mobilizer for the future.
- 4. Kevin Kompelien, who transitioned on April 1st from EFCA President to serve as the 17th President of Trinity International University, greeted us in person on Tuesday morning. The EFCA Board of Directors appointed Carlton Harris, Executive Vice President of National Ministries, as Acting President of the EFCA to fulfill the remainder of Kevin Kompelien's elected term.
- 5. A highlight was the acceptance of two new churches for NCD membership: Living Hope Church in Maple Grove and Northside Neighborhood Church, North Minneapolis.

We were challenged through three keynote messages on "Faithfully Loving His Bride", delivered by Brian Berg, retired pastor of Woodlands Church in Plover, Wis. His messages explored why church leaders should consider loving the church they serve central to their calling; what it looks like to love a local church; and how to stay faithful to that calling for the long haul.

Liz and I enjoyed meeting new and old friends, plus connecting with missionaries supported by Grace. We attended ministry affinity groups and workshops including: "The Church and Gender Confusion," "Doing Excellent Missionary Care in Your Church," and "Care Ministries." We also attended the Shamineau Ministry Lunch where we heard an update on the exciting ministry happening at camp.

We thank the Elders for giving us this opportunity to represent Grace and to hear how "our NCD family of churches exists to glorify God by multiplying transformational churches among all people." Together we were encouraged to move forward in our commitment to evangelism, the Gospel, and the Scriptures.

April Food Distribution Ministry Update

It was a very nice evening for the April food distribution, and we were able to serve about 250 families. We continue to receive comments from many of our guests and volunteers about how grateful they are for this ministry, and for the people of Grace, who so willingly donate to make this happen. Our guests are also very humbled that you pray for them, that you pray for people you don't even know. Thank you for loving on these people!

There have been several opportunities to develop relationships with our volunteers. This month, cards were made announcing the children's program "God Squad". Several of our volunteers were interested in coming and said they would be asking others to join them for the concert.

We almost ran out of the bags that we use for produce each month. On a whim, Mark stopped at Cub to see if we could purchase some from them. He told them about the food distribution ministry at Grace and the person said we could have some bags. When Mark wanted to pay for the bags, he was told that this was a great ministry to the community, and they were pleased to be able to donate them. We received 2000 bags and were told to come back when we needed more. Praise the Lord!!

Our Daily Bread has a quarterly devotional book that we were able to give to every guest as a gift from Grace. Several of our volunteers took one. They were also available in Spanish. It was an opportunity to encourage our guests through stories that they can relate to, with scripture passages to reinforce what they read.

There is a gentleman named William who has come for a couple of months now. He is not very talkative or open to sharing much. He seems sad, defeated, and all he ever says is "life is so hard". We have a lady who comes in a small pickup truck, towing a very old camper. This is her home, everything she owns is in this camper and truck. She keeps running out of gas because she doesn't have much money. It sits wherever it goes empty until she can find a way to fill the gas tank again. She is afraid she will lose her home because the Fridley police are threatening to impound both vehicles.

We ask that you pray for William and this lady. We ask that you pray for the many people who have shared a recent cancer diagnosis. Pray for the people who need reliable vehicles, jobs, and family reconciliation. Since last spring Grace Fridley has been buffeted by strong winds of change, beginning with the Vision Team's recommendations, the ministry evaluations, and Pastor Gerald's retirement. And those were just the beginning! Through the months, the elders have heard sadness, worry, regret, and trepidation from a number of our brothers and sisters, about one or another of the gusts of change. Even the exciting adventure of calling and welcoming a new senior pastor can bring anxiety to our church family.

That's okay. It's even healthy, to give expression to those feelings and unburden ourselves of them. Scripture tells us to bear one another's burdens and so fulfill the law of Christ. We can't guarantee that we will agree with you, but we want to hear you out and to help, if we can. If one part of the body is hurting, that affects us all. We especially want you to bring concerns about changes in the church directly to us, so that we can provide -- or track down, if necessary -- the right answers.

The winds and waves toss, but the church sails on through any storm. Our Captain holds it all in the palm of His hand -- no, in the word of his mouth. Our trust is in Him, and we follow Him best when we follow Him together. Let's bear each other's burdens.
