MIXING BUSINESS WITH PLEASURE

"Mixing business with pleasure." "Blurring the lines between work and personal life."

You've heard those cliches related to lots of workers.

But, work is goofy for many church staff. The layperson's Sabbath is the pastor's primary work day!

Sunday is a big day for me. I put my "game face" on the night before. Praying, prepping, contemplating, and rehearsing mentally and physically consume my heart and mind, starting about supper time on Saturday. The next morning, after more of the same, I show up at church and interface with all kinds of God's people and also know that I'm expected to "deliver the goods." Then, that's followed by more cordial and caring interactions with the faith-family.

On Sundays, at church, I have a one-track (more accurately, a two-track) mind. And, my own personal one-anothering and worshipping are necessarily displaced by the work of pastoring and preaching.

That's my reality.

However, that needn't be the reality for all staff—like, church support staff. Even ministry staff and teaching staff can benefit when the congregants

follow a simple protocol. That protocol is to postpone any church business you can for the days after Sunday.

When you bump into a custodial or office staff member on Sunday, you're probably tempted to interrupt their sharing in community or their engaging in the worship service with a "quick, this won't take long" reminder, request, or favor.

Even when yours is something brief or easy, it often piles on. That's one reason working in the same place that one worships can be kind of a downer. But, you can help. Thank you.

Instead of blurring (or obliterating) the line between their work and their worship, you could pull out your phone and start a text or email to that staff person. You can finish it later (like during my sermon:)) or when you get home. And they can respond when they're in work mode instead of when they're in fellowship and/or worship mode.

I know it may seem like it's not a big deal. But, it can be a weight—a weight that I'd rather church staffers would not have to carry.

Thanks. I thought you'd want to know. You're great!

From the desk of Student Ministries:

I had a thought about the crucifixion the other day that was prompted by a question from one of my kids.

There are two big bundles of nerves that pass through the wrist on their way into the hand. When the soldiers drove the spike into Jesus' arm, it would have gone right through or been adjacent to both of the ulnar and median nerves.

Every time Jesus needed to take a breath, he had to pull up with his arms and chest, and he had to pull against that spike for leverage. And every time, those nerves would have ground mercilessly against that rough iron. Every ragged breath. Thirty breaths a minute. Minute after minute. Hour on hour. *Until his body literally broke.*

Our salvation is a gift from God. But make no mistake, it's not free. It was purchased at a very high price indeed.


